Item Analysis of Reading Comprehension Test of Wattpad Readers and Writers Community

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Abstract: Reading is one of the four basic language skills that should be mastered by language learners. It is the ability to understand words contained in a document and make use of the knowledge for personal growth and development. To measure the learners learning progress in reading skills, normally, the test must be given periodically. It also can be used to diagnose a teacher's competence in teaching and to find out how much the learners have learned.

Keywords: wattpad, document, learning measure

1. Introduction

Reading is one of the four basic language skills that should be mastered by language learners. It is the ability to understand words contained in a document and make use of the knowledge for personal growth and development (Dadzie, 2008). This skill is necessary due it can enrich and increase knowledge. Schultz (1982) states that through reading, language learners are able to draw the meaning of words and get the information from a text. It means that by reading, the learners will gain new understanding, new ideas, and also new knowledge that can expand their views later. Richards and Renandya (2003:273) said that many foreign language students often have reading as one of their most important goals. Bahadır (2012) claims that in today's societies, reading has considered indispensable for a life of high quality. Reading in foreign language learning at present focuses on guiding the students in developing their skills in reading, mainly leading them to direct comprehension of the text.

To measure the learners learning progress in reading skills, normally, the test must be given periodically. It also can be used to diagnose a teacher's competence in teaching and to find out how much the learners have learned.

2. Materials and Methods

This reading comprehension test was conducted to measure to what extent the participants were able to understand the text that they read. Most of the participants in this test are teenagers who are Wattpad active users who gathered in a community of readers and writers. Wattpad is a platform that provides a thousand books from various genres and allows users to share their own stories. In other words, Wattpad is not only a platform for reading but also writing. Therefore, since the participants were often enough to read in that application, the tester decided to choose them as test takers. The test was conducted between the middle to end of May 2020. The participants are given the test online through Google Forms and distributed by Whatsapp Group application.

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3. Results

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TEXT 1

Wattpad is one of the various social media which was founded by Allen Lau and Ivan Yuen in 2006 in Toronto, Canada. It is the biggest community on the web, which allows people to read stories from all online writers all over the world, and they even can share their own stories through writing. Wattpad provides a thousand books from various genres, such as classics, general fiction, historical fiction, non-fiction, poetry, fanfiction, spiritual, comedy, and teen fiction. In February 2007, Wattpad announced the addition of over 17,000 e-books from Project Gutenberg making them available to mobile users and has been downloaded over 5 million times until June 2009. As of 2018, there are more than 400 million stories uploads on Wattpad and increased to 665 million in August 2019. Although Wattpad available in over 50 languages, 77% of its content has been written in English.

This platform claims to have an audience of more than 80 million users where 70% of users are female, and 80% of whom are millennials or Gen Z, who can directly interact with the writers and share their opinions with fellow readers. That is why Wattpad being popular among the teenager. Wattpad can read through computers, smartphone, and tablets. In 2016, there are 45 million people in a month who has access to Wattpad, where 85% of its traffic and usage comes from mobile devices. The practicality might be one of the reasons why Wattpad also been favoured.

Interestingly, one of uniqueness in the Wattpad is that the average writer is a teenager, where most of them write a fanfiction story. Fanfiction is a story where the characters are the idol of the writer. This phenomenon is understandable, considering of idolizing an idol is characteristic of teenagers. In the teenager's phase, they tend to look for someone who can be imitated, both from the character, attitude, and behaviour. However, it must remember that sometimes, excessive idolizing can make them have an exaggerated imagination, and it can give a negative effect, due they will tend to be irrational. Therefore, they must have the self-control to avoid the negative effect of excessively idolizing.

TEXT 2

Creative writing is an art of sorts - the art of making things up. It has often defined as the writing of fiction, where the author creates events, scenes and characters, sometimes even a world. Different from academic writing that is written based on research and compiled systematically, creative writing is usually written based on the writer's imagination, thoughts, and feelings. The purpose of creative writing is to both entertain and share the human experience, like love or loss. Writers attempt to get at a truth about humanity through poetics and storytelling.

Reading helps develop people's writing skills, but writing helps develop cognitive growth, organizational abilities, and the power to influence others through persuasion. In short, writing powers the brain, and creative writing encourages them to exercise their creative minds and practise using their imaginations. It improves their ability to come up with creative thoughts and problem solve, builds confidence and discipline. This broadens their thought processes, which can lead to success in many areas, including problem solving and analysis.

The types of creative writing include; Poetry, Plays, Movie and television scripts, Fiction (novels, novellas, and short stories), Songs, Speeches, Memoirs, and Personal essays. Some nonfiction types of writing can also be considered creative writing. Memoirs and personal essays, for example, can be written creatively to inform your readers about your life in an expressive way. It is due to these types are written in the first person, it's easier for them to be creative. Meanwhile, some techniques that commonly used in creative writing, namely; 1) Character development, the process of building a character with depth, personality, and clear motivations or the changes a character undergoes throughout a story as a result of their actions and experiences. 2) Plot development, the sequence of events that make up a story, more specifically, how the story develops, unfolds, and moves in time. 3) Vivid setting, to makes the fiction more believable. 4) Underlying theme, the main idea of the story. 5) Point of view, the narrator's position in the description of events. 6) Dialogue, the conversations between characters that can help bring the story to life. 7) Anecdotes, the small stories within the big story that offer readers a chance to learn more about a character without simply stating it directly. 8) Metaphors and similes, to create vivid sight and sound images. 9) Imaginative language, expresses writer's

thought or feeling in a unique or poetic way. 10) Emotional appeal, a method of persuasion that has designed to create an emotional response.

TEXT 3

Jane Austen was an English novelist whose books, set among the English middle and upper classes, are notable for their wit, social observation and insights into the lives of early 19th century women. She was born in Steventon, Hampshire on December 16, 1775, and grew up in a tight-knit family. Austen was the seventh of eight children, with six brothers and one sister. When Austen was 7, she and her only sister, Cassandra, were sent to Oxford to attend school but sometime later the girls came down with typhus and were brought back to Steventon. When Austen was 9, they attended the Abbey School in Reading. Shortly after enrolling, however, the girls were withdrawn, because their father could no longer afford tuition.

At the age of 12, Austen was writing for herself as well as for her family. She wrote poems and several parodies of the dramatic fiction that was popular at the time, such as History of England and Love and Friendship. She then compiled and titled them: Volume the First, Volume the Second and Volume the Third. In 1795, when she was 20, Austen entered a productive phase and created what was later referred to as her "First Trilogy." Prompted by increasing social engagements and flirtations, she began writing Elinor and Marianne, a novel in letters, which would eventually be reworked and retitled Sense and Sensibility. The following year, she wrote First Impressions, which was rejected by a publisher in 1797. It was the first version of *Pride and Prejudice*. She began another novel in 1798, titled Susan, which evolved into Northanger Abbey. Austen finished the final drafts of Sense and Sensibility and Pride and Prejudice in 1811. They were published shortly after and she immediately set to work on Mansfield Park. In 1814, Mansfield Park was published and Emma was started. By this time, Austen was gaining some recognition for her writing, despite the fact that neither Sense and Sensibility or Pride and Prejudice were published under her name.

Austen began showing symptoms of illness while she worked on Persuasion, her last completed novel. It was published with Northanger Abbey after her death. Unknown at the time, Austen most likely suffered from Addison's disease, whose symptoms include fever, back pain, nausea and irregular skin pigmentation. On her deathbed, when asked by her sister Cassandra if there was anything she required, she requested only "death itself." She died at the age of 41 on July 18, 1817, with her sister at her side.

Based on the results of the items analysis of the questions that have been tested, there are only two questions (13, 16) that qualify with the level of difficulty as medium (0.30 -0.70), discrimination index is good (0.30 \leq gbis \leq 0.70), and all of the distractions are good (>5%). Three numbers of the question (8, 24, 25) must be revised due to the discrimination index only between $0.20 \le \text{obis} \le 0.29$. Ten number of question (2, 3, 4, 12, 14, 17, 20, 21, 29, 30) actually, are qualify due to the level of difficulty being medium (0.30 - 0.70) and the discrimination index being good $(0.30 \le \text{obis} \le 0.70)$, however, not all the distractors are good (≤5%). Therefore, the items must be revised in order to make them qualified. Fifteen numbers of questions are not qualified. Level of difficulty question number 1, 7, 9, 15, 22, 23 > 70% (> 0.70). It means that the items are easy. Level of difficulty question number 5, 28 < 30% (< 0.30). It means that the items are difficult. Meanwhile, question number 6, 10, 11, 18, 19, 26, 27, and 28 are not qualified due to the discrimination index value < 0.20.

5. Conclusions

Based on the data result above, some conclusions could be drawn as follows:

- If the level of difficulty value is between 0.30 0.70, the discrimination index is $0.30 \le \text{pbis} \le 0.70$, and all distractors value > 5% of the items are well categorized or qualified.
- The items must be revised if the discrimination value is between $0.20 \le \text{gbis} \le$ 0.29, despite the level of difficulty value between 0.30 - 0.70.
- The items must be revised distractors if the distractors value < 5%, despite the level of difficulty and discrimination index qualified.
- The items tested are automatically unqualified if the level of difficulty value is> 70% (> 0.70) or < 30% (< 0.30).

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
