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IMPROVING STUDENTS WRITING SKILLS THROUGH CANVA APPLICATION AT SMP MUHAMMADIYAH IMOGIRI YOGYAKARTA

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Abstract: The objective of this study was to improve the writing abilities of students in Class VII E at SMP Muhammadiyah Imogiri, Yogyakarta by utilizing the CANVA application to write recount text. However, based on observation, several issues were identified, including inadequate writing skills among students, lack of interest in writing, the teacher's writing approach, the media's role, and limited internet access due to the school's prohibition of smartphones. Based on these observations, it was found that students faced difficulties in writing, particularly in terms of the generic structure. Additionally, they lacked knowledge on identifying and rectifying errors in their writing, as their English teacher predominantly focused on directly correcting their mistakes. This action research study comprised two cycles and included 25 students from Class VII E at SMP Muhammadiyah Imogiri, Yogyakarta. The study involved one English teacher as a collaborator and the researcher herself. Qualitative data was collected for this study. However, the qualitative data was gathered through observations of the teaching and learning process during the action implementation, as well as interviews conducted with the students and the collaborator regarding the implementation actions. Moreover, the qualitative data took the form of field notes and transcripts of the interviews. The findings of this study indicate that the utilization of the CANVA application is an effective method for improving students' writing skills, as supported by the analysis of qualitative data. The learning process became more engaging, and the students actively enjoyed the writing process. By incorporating the CANVA application into the teaching-learning process and employing writing activities through this platform, the challenges faced by students in writing were successfully mitigated.

1. Introduction (Heading 1)

Traditional teaching methods continue to prevail in schools as computers are not yet widely integrated into the educational system. The teaching process is predominantly characterized by a frontal approach, wherein the teacher assumes a more central role with limited student interaction. According to Stosic (2015) stated

that one of the drawbacks of this type of learning is the inability of students to progress at their own pace and the lack of active engagement on their part.

The advent of learning technology in the late 20th century has brought about rapid changes in the education system. Based on the explanation above, this research used Canva as a tool to improve students' skills at Junior High School Muhammadiyah Imogiri Yogyakarta, especially in writing skills.

2. Literature Review

2.1 Writing Skill

Definition of Writing Skill

According to Harmer (2007), writing, like speaking, is recognized as a productive skill in language learning. When students engage in language production, they are required to utilize their knowledge to generate language in order to effectively communicate, whether through spoken or written forms.

As mentioned by the psycholinguist Eric Lenneberg, as cited in Brown (2001), asserts that writing differs from speaking in terms of the learning process. While language acquisition through speaking occurs naturally as part of human behavior, writing is considered a learned behavior, akin to learning how to swim. In order to acquire writing skills, individuals typically require instruction from someone within a literate society who can teach them.

Alternatively, when viewed as a process, writing emphasizes the different stages involved in the act of writing. According to Brown (2001) stated that this includes the initial step of jotting down ideas and subsequently transforming those thoughts into written words. This perspective highlights the significance of the writing process itself rather than solely focusing on the final product.

Given that writing serves as a means of communicating with others through written language, it is essential for clarity to be maintained. Unlike in speaking, where non-verbal cues like gestures, body language, or facial expressions can aid in conveying the message, in writing, the message relies solely on the written form. Consequently, according to Yulianti (2014) stated that the researcher bears the responsibility of ensuring that the reader comprehends the conveyed message effectively.

2.2 The Procedures of Teaching Writing Skills

2.2.1 Pre-writing

a. Planning

- 1) The process of generating ideas for a written paper is often referred to as "invention" or "the discovery process." This stage aids students in exploring their existing knowledge about a subject or identifying what they need to learn in order to effectively write about it.
- 2) Establishing the objectives and goals for both the paper and the overall writing activity is crucial. These goals can range from broad statements such as "I aim to persuade my readers that geology

- is an exciting major" to more specific targets. The plans and goals should align with the initial motivations and needs that prompted the writing activity in order to effectively address them.
- 3) Grouping and organizing concepts and ideas is an essential activity that aids the writer in exploring topics and considering various approaches to present them. This process enables the writer to structure their thoughts and determine effective ways to convey the information
- b. Techniques for generating and joining ideas

Planning is an ongoing process in writing and is particularly crucial during the initial stages when setting the initial goals. This is when the writer identifies, develops, and shapes the audience, author's role, subject, and purpose of the writing. Many writers benefit from an unstructured phase during the planning activity, where ideas are allowed to flow freely without strict organization. In the following discussion, both unstructured and structured techniques for planning activities will be explained.

- 1) Free Association
 - This method does not involve any writing but instead allows the mind to freely explore a subject to see what emerges from memory. Free association is particularly effective when working on assignments that offer a lot of flexibility and allow for a wide range of possibilities.
- 2) Brainstorming
 - Brainstorming can be a beneficial next step after engaging in free association, especially when your mind has generated a sufficient number of potentially valuable ideas that you wish to record on paper. The brainstorming technique involves setting aside any mental filters or self-censorship and focusing on your subject or a specific aspect of it.
- 3) Free Writing
 - Free writing can be a beneficial approach in various scenarios. It can be useful when you have a broad and open-ended subject or when you are in the process of searching for a subject. Additionally, free writing can help when you feel overwhelmed by an excessive amount of information and struggle to organize it effectively. Instead of struggling, it is advised to relax and engage in free writing about the subject for a short duration, typically five or ten minutes. This exercise may lead to the emergence of valuable groupings and connections between ideas. If this doesn't occur, it is recommended to take a break and return to brainstorming when you are refreshed.
- 4) Mind Mapping
 - Mind mapping is a technique that falls between the structured nature of certain methods and the more open-ended approach of free writing. It offers a balance between structure and flexibility. Mind mapping encourages the free flow of ideas while also enabling the visual representation of relationships among those ideas without imposing a strict organizational framework.
- 5) Ideas Tree
 - This technique is more organized and structured compared to mind mapping. It involves representing ideas not only in relation to each other but also in hierarchical arrangements. The hierarchical arrangements can vary, such as from larger to smaller concepts, from general to specific ideas, from main ideas to supporting details, and so on. According to Leggett (1991) stated that the specific arrangement depends on the subject matter and the purpose of creating the hierarchical tree.

2.2.2 Drafting

There are how to organize the material of the students:

a. Time

When it comes to writing narration, which involves recounting events, a natural and logical structure to follow is time order. Whether students are describing an automobile accident or narrating a historical event, it is customary to present the events in the chronological sequence in which they occurred.

b. Space

When it comes to describing a scene or an object, employing spatial order can be suitable. This approach involves focusing on the scene or object from the perspective of either yourself or the readers. From there, students can systematically describe the details in a spatial arrangement that best serves their purpose, such as moving from left to right, top to bottom, front to back, inside to outside, or any other spatial orientation that effectively conveys the desired information.

c. General to Particular/Particular to General

When it comes to explaining an idea or concept, one effective approach is to utilize a particular structure. This structure involves initially presenting the general idea and then providing further clarification by citing specific instances or examples that support the generalization. This approach involves arranging evidence or supporting points in a strategic manner, starting with the least important and gradually building up to the most significant. When it comes to writing, highlighting the similarities between points is referred to as comparison, while noting the differences is known as a contrast. It is common for comparison and contrast to coexist within the same paper, although this is not always the case.

f. Analysis and Classification

Analysis refers to the deliberate process of comprehending something by deconstructing it and examining its individual components. It involves breaking down the subject into smaller parts for a more thorough understanding. The analysis is also known as partition or division in certain contexts. It is important to note that classification without analysis is referred to as a stereotype, where generalizations are made without a deeper examination or understanding.

g. Definition

If your goal is to clarify an abstract concept or introduce something unfamiliar to your audience, employing a definition can be a suitable organizational structure. This approach involves providing a clear and concise explanation of the concept or subject matter to ensure that your audience grasps its meaning and significance. - a. Surface Changes




Figure 1. Example
